I OTH LANGUAGE ARTS

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Course Description: This course will be challenging with the objective being to heighten reading, writing, and critical thinking skills of students. Here, we will investigate the processes that make for purposeful reading and quality writing, and then utilize those strategies to support your own work. Throughout the year, we will engage the writing process; non-fiction work; fiction work; creative writing; argumentative thinking; and analysis of argumentative texts. We will work emphasizing reading and writing for purpose, self-revision, peer-revision, and collaborative group work and discussion to uncover and attain mastery of the curriculum. With dedication and extremely consistent hard work, students will have a perfect chance of succeeding in this class.

Philosophy: if you plan on minimal participation, mediocre preparation, and reliance on luck, intervention, or begging, you won't make it. Please plan on cultivating an active mind in order to learn and grow every day in this class, in high school, and in life beyond

Participation: you will be rewarded participation points for being actively engaged in class and in the activities we do- I expect all students to voice comments, questions, opinions, and thoughts in every discussion.
